Student application journey

NHS Bursary funding is available for students studying to become a doctor or dentist:

- if you're studying a 5 or 6-year undergraduate course (you can apply from year 5)
- if you're studying a 3 or 4-year graduate-entry course (you can apply from year 2)

The NHS Bursary offers a non-means tested grant of £1,000 per academic year, tuition fee contribution and a means tested bursary based on your household income. You can also apply for additional support – including Dependants' Allowance, Disabled Students Allowance, and more.

Want to apply? Here's what to expect

01



Register for your NHS Bursary account.

02



Once you have registered, you can apply for the NHS Bursary and additional allowances through your online account. Here, you can also upload your supporting evidence.

03



If we need additional information from your partner or parent(s), we will send them a separate link to supply their supporting evidence for your application.

04



Your application is assessed within 20 working days. If approved, the payment details will be added to your account.

05



You will receive a payment at the beginning of each term.
